Dear Parents, Carers, Guardians and Students

I am writing to update you with details of how **Standardised Centre Assessed Grades** will be published this year. As you know the GCSE and A-Level examinations were cancelled this year due to the forced closure of schools across the UK. We have written previously to outline how students will be awarded **Standardised Centre Assessed Grades** and now we are in a position to explain how students will receive their grades later this summer.

When will I get my results?

The **Standardised Centre Assessed Grades** for Year 11 students will be published on Thursday 20 August for GCSE and Level two vocational qualifications. The current Coronavirus situation means that we are going to change the way in which results are collected so that we can avoid too many students being on site at the same time and maximise the opportunities to speak to members of staff to seek advice and guidance.

How will I get my results?

Results will be made available at **9am on Thursday 20 August** through the student's GO 4 Schools account. A hard copy of the statement of results will be posted to the home address too. Please note that exam results will not be available through the parent GO 4 Schools account so **students must know their login details for their own account**. You can access GO 4 Schools from the main Lord Grey Academy website and students will need to enter details as follows: pnumber@lordgrey.org.uk followed by their password. The password can be reset easily by the students, but the reset link will be sent to their school email address. It would be sensible for students to login to both their GO 4 Schools account and their school email account over the next few days so that any issues can be resolved when staff are still in school.

Once you have got your results.

All students in Year 11 need their results to access the next step of their education or training. Normally there is a bit of a rush to see members of staff about results and to discuss their next steps which sometimes leads to long queues. As we have changed the way the results are published we will be able to offer more appointments than in previous years.

Have you applied for Lord Grey Sixth Form?

If you have applied for a place at Lord Grey Sixth Form you will receive an email on Thursday 20 August from the Sixth Form team informing you if you have got on to the course that you have applied for.

- If you receive an email saying that your **course choices are confirmed** you do not need to do anything else before registration into the Sixth Form
- If you receive an email saying that you have not met the entry requirements for the **courses you applied for** you will be contacted by the Sixth Form team via the student school Gmail address
