Dear Parents, Carers, Guardians and Students

I am writing to update you with details of how **Standardised Centre Assessed Grades** will be published this year. As you know the GCSE and A-Level examinations were cancelled this year due to the forced closure of schools across the UK. We have written previously to outline how students will be awarded **Standardised Centre Assessed Grades** and now we are in a position to explain how students will receive their grades later this summer.

#### **When will I get my results?**

The **Standardised Centre Assessed Grades** for Year 12 and 13 students will be published on Thursday 13 August for A/S and A-Level qualifications. The current Coronavirus situation means that we are going to change the way in which results are collected so that we can avoid too many students being on site at the same time and maximise the opportunities to speak to members of staff to seek advice and guidance.

#### **How will I get my results?**

Results will be made available at 9am on Thursday 13 August for Level 3 courses, and Thursday 20 August for Level 2 courses, through the student's GO 4 Schools account. A hard copy of the statement of results will be posted to the home address too. Please note that exam results will not be available through the parent GO 4 Schools account so **students must know their login details for their own account**. You can access GO 4 Schools from the main Lord Grey Academy website and students will need to enter details as follows: [Pnumber@lordgrey.org.uk](mailto:Pnumber@lordgrey.org.uk) followed by their password. The password can be reset easily by the students, but the reset link will be sent to their school email address. It would be sensible for students to login to both their GO 4 Schools account and their school email account over the next few days so that any issues can be resolved when staff are still in school.

#### **Once you have got your results.**

Year 12 and 13 students may need their results to access the next step of their education, especially university or training. Normally there is a bit of a rush to see members of staff about results and to discuss their next steps which sometimes leads to long queues. As we have changed the way the results are published we will be able to offer more appointments than in previous years.

#### **Have you applied for university?**

#### **Have you completed Year 12 but are not sure about what to do next?**
